Sean Dunbar and his good wife Mary had no child of their own and from the very beginning thought of me as their true son. Being devout believers they had no doubt that I had been sent to

them as a gift from God. "Did we not pray for such a miracle? Did we not find you in a stable, Robbie?' Mary said, and indeed repeated it often, marveling at it each time. "And were you not curled up in the straw like Jesus himself in Bethlehem?"


