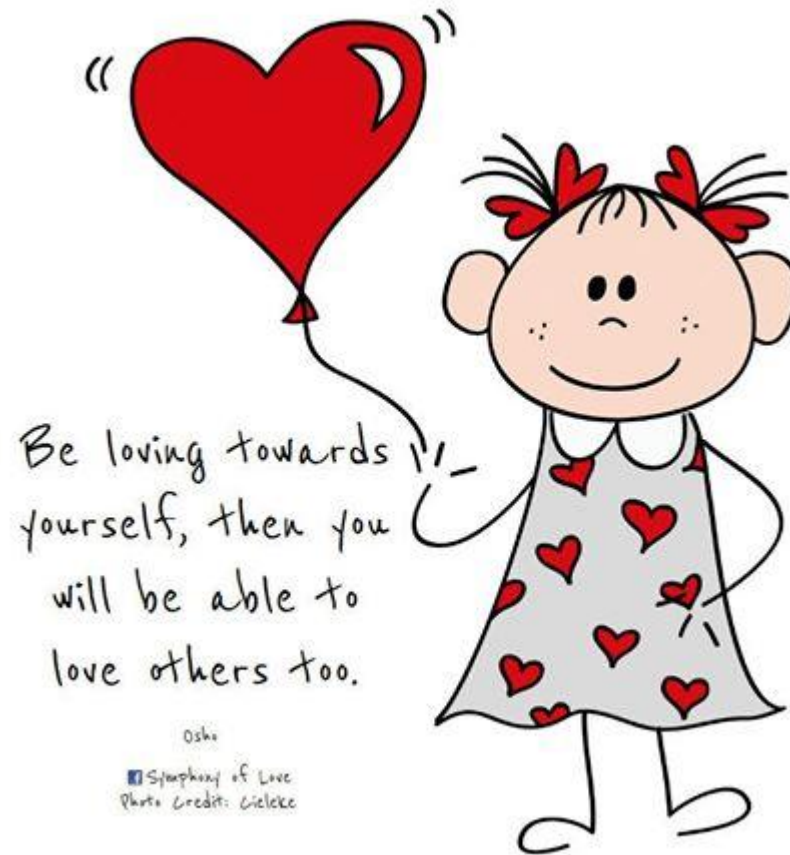

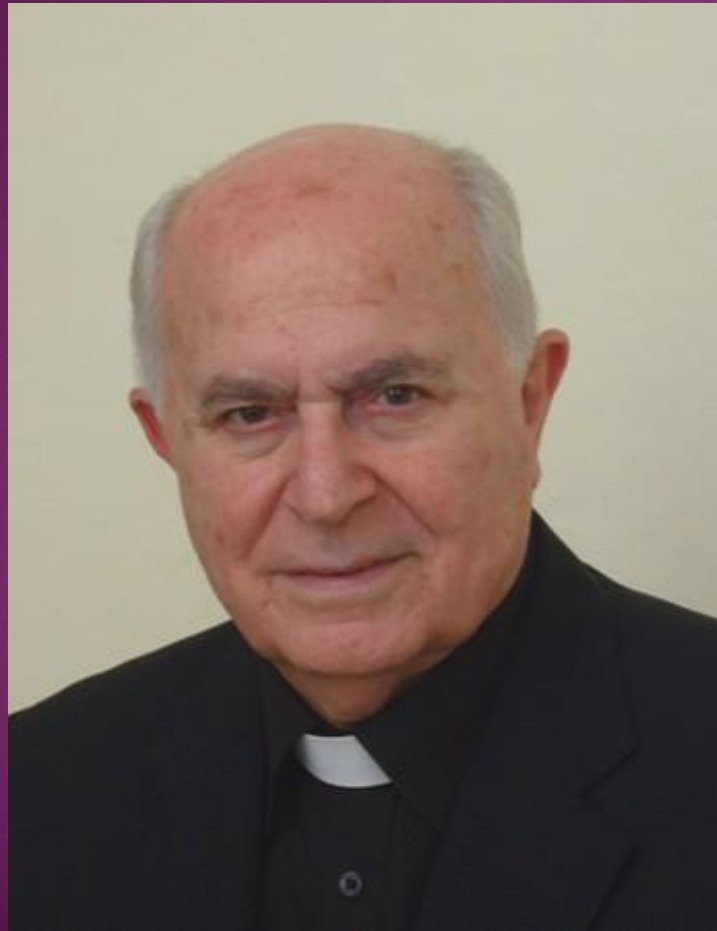
FOR THIS YEAR'S GOAL, EACH YEAR LEVEL

Monsignor Victor Grech

In 1977, Monsignor Joseph Mercieca, appointed Mons. Victor Grech as the Archbishop's Delegate for the Secretariat, for Diocesan Social and Charitable Action.
